
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#### **Bourtons' Gardening Club**

#### **Highways & Road defects - Progress Report**

Both of our new FixMyStreet superusers - Cllr Beales & Mr Jon Pheasey - have now been fully trained and received on-site guidance from OCC, so are operational. They have already completed one inspection and reported a number of significant potholes which are targeted to be fixed by 4<sup>th</sup> Feb. Residents should continue to report potholes they are aware of on FixMyStreet but they can also advise our superusers. Residents are further reminded that if they suffer any significant vehicle damage or personal injury as a direct result of a pothole they may be able to make a claim against OCC. The PC would be happy to assist with this if required so please contact a Cllr. The trees causing concern on Main Street continue to be at risk and the Chairman has spoken directly to Arboriculture Officers at both OCC & CDC, but there is now a query as to whose responsibility the trees are! Further discussion will happen.

**Parking issues - Manor Road** - congestion continues to cause concerns, particularly relating to vehicles parked in the area near the pub. This has prevented oil deliveries to Manor Road and difficulties for refuse collections. **Parking issues - LB** - concerns continue re vehicles parked on Spring Lane causing obstruction. Council will investigate with OCC the possibility of creating a small parking layby in the area to assist the congestion.

**Public Transport:** No response from Stagecoach and confusion remains about service provision. Differing information appears on the bus stop timetables. This is an important issue as developers are using incorrect information to support planning applications claiming a bus service operates!

**Planning: New applications:** 22/03870/Q56: Mr & Mrs Aries, Home Farm Barn, Crow Lane, GB: re-application of previous submission to allow consultation on changes.

**Decisions:** 22/03380/F: Mr Lowin, 11 Manor Close, GB: ground floor extension - **PERMITTED** 

CDC Local Plan Review (LPR): the previously announced publication of the draft Plan for consultation has been delayed by CDC and is expected later this month. We have seen the draft of the main body of text, submitted to the CDC Executive earlier this month, but not information on the offered sites. This is awaited and we will respond within the 6 week consultation period. The Bourtons' Community Plan: work continues alongside finalisation of our response to the CDC LPR as some of the info will be common to both. Great Bourton Conservation area: interest continues and it was AGREED that a project plan be developed and initial investigations commenced. The plan will include community engagement proposals, area determination and a process review.

**Enforcement:** No updates - Jane Law (Senior Enforcement Officer) has been contacted for update.

**County & District Councillors report:** DCllr Chapman reported that he had seen the proposed draft version of the LPR but not the offered sites data which is of great significance to local villages. He will keep us fully briefed.

**Defibrillators:** Both defibrillators reported working.

**Website:** Work continues on new pages for Wildlife project. A new policy has been drafted for the website and this was considered and it was **RESOLVED** that it should be adopted. Concerns were expressed by Cllrs about a number of scam emails that have been received. It was pointed out that this is not directly connected to either the website nor our email provider, but unfortunately a consequence of modern life. Cllrs were instructed to take great care to ensure they do not open potential scam emails.

**Projects update: Garners Field**: A client care letter [contractual agreement] has now been received from CDC re the adoption of the LAP. Unfortunately this does not make clear the understanding that no legal costs will be charged to us; this is being challenged and Council will NOT agree to the adoption if this is not the case. Otherwise work on the adoption continues but we have been advised it may be an extended process.

**Garners Field**: A discussion was held regarding residents' dissatisfaction with the level of service being provided by Ground Solutions, the company appointed by HH to manage the public areas on the development. It was **RESOLVED** that the Clerk would meet with a representative resident to understand the current situation, and report back to Council in February. **LB Project**: No further work due to weather conditions, but the emergence of the snowdrops is awaited! Discussions with the LB Improvement group to agree further steps.

**Tree pruning in Churchyard**: It has been identified that urgent pruning is required. A quote has been obtained from our preferred supplier and it was **RESOLVED** that this be accepted and work be authorised. The Clerk will ensure that this work will be budgeted correctly in future years.

**Community Speedwatch**: due to the impact of the works on Main Street no further activity has taken place. Once these works have concluded Council will establish the level of support from the community and subject to sufficient volunteers and the appointment of a co-ordinator, the project can start. **Playgrounds & Public Spaces: GB playground** - the search for a local person to fit the swing seats continues as it is proving difficult to locate someone who has the necessary level of insurance. The Clerk will speak with Banbury Town Council to see if they can assist.

**Allotments:** Final rent payments to be chased. Letters to tenants breaching their tenancy agreements to be followed up. Damage to plot dividing fences to be reviewed and costs understood. A process to support essential work to be established and the way of raising funds to be clarified.

A metered bill has now been received from Castle Water for the past year which shows consumption higher than anticipated. A review will be completed to ensure that costs are covered by rental income. It was **RESOLVED** that this bill will be paid and sent with a letter to try and resolve the current situation over historic water bills.

Halls: CH: Nothing to report.

**VH**: An estimate will be sought to repair/replace damaged external window-sills. Oil tank casing will also be replaced. The extended lease expires in April and a letter will be sent to the VHMC Chairman regarding the renewal process.

**Healthcare:** Cllr Johnson advised that Cropredy Surgery has confirmed that their list is now nearly full and only new patients living within their territory can be accommodated.

**Finance & Administration:** Following incidents of fraud involving Clerks in other areas we have completed a review of our internal control procedures. The Internal Controls Policy has been updated and it was **RESOLVED** that this be adopted. Further the current Financial Report - FIN REP - was considered inadequate by the Clerk and a new version was proposed that allowed Cllrs to see the full details of the monthly bank reconciliation along with the cheque requests; it was **RESOLVED** that this be adopted.

The FIN REP for December & January previously circulated in the new format was **ACCEPTED.** It was **RESOLVED** that 4 payments requested totalling £364.12 be approved. To comply with the requirements of the Transparency Code those in excess of £100 are listed below

A request has been received from Wardington PC for us to replace our cheque sent in payment for the hire of their Hall last October which has been lost in transmission. It was **RESOLVED** that this be supported.

The previously **AGREED** precept of £13,595 which represents an increase of 5% was confirmed and it was **RESOLVED** that the Clerk should formally request this from CDC as is required. This will mean a slight reduction in reserves in order to avoid a higher increase.

The previously circulated Risk Assessment was considered and with only very minor changes it was **RESOLVED** to adopt it. Further discussion then followed about the earlier minute regarding scam emails; electronic communications are not covered in the Risk Assessment and this will be added with the document being re-presented for adoption in February.

**Correspondence:** Chairman has arranged a meeting with Voneus to discuss the need for latest comms development in GB.

The Bell Land Charity has been contacted regarding monies which may be available for the refurbishment of the Parish clock.

No new business was introduced.

Next meeting: Tuesday, 7<sup>th</sup> February 2023 at 19:30hrs in the Community Hall.
