Although there have been clear challenges over the past two years, it is an absolute delight and privilege to have the position of Headteacher of Cropredy CE Primary School. This is supported by the dedicated and passionate staff team that I have, who strive to make every day memorable for the children. This is through the organisation of exciting and engaging learning experiences indoors as well as using our wonderful outdoor spaces.

The children in school bring everything to life. They provide enjoyment and inspiration each day across all aspects of their learning demonstrating a thirst for learning, kindness, support and friendship to all members of the school community. My privileged role as Headteacher enables me to see and share many special moments with the children; sharing their learning and seeing the impact that our exciting lessons have on their attainment across every area of the curriculum.
