Bourtons' Parish Council

Snippets from the June Parish Council Meeting...

Following the Thames Water works in the parish, we held a meeting with their representatives, their contractors' representative and Nick Watson (OCC) to discuss the damage to verges during their operations and their inadequate communications to residents. After a 'walk-around' to assess the damage they ultimately responded by email to say that the reinstatements were carried out at the time when works were carried out. We have responded to explain, in no uncertain terms, that this is not the case. We await their reply! We expect the 20mph restrictions throughout the parish, to be implemented by the end of October. It would be prudent therefore to begin the Community Speedwatch initiative at the same time but this will only happen if we can appoint a co-ordinator to manage rotas etc. More volunteers will be welcome to share the shifts. It has been noted in other parishes around the country, that carrying out a Speedwatch, even one day a week, makes a difference. Cllrs Duckworth and Upton are working on getting a definite Stagecoach timetable. There are three published versions, none of which Stagecoach have confirmed. Currently the 77 service stops only at LB, on Thurs and Sat, although it would appear that it passes GB every day. If we can use the remainder of the Section 106 monies we have for transport to install a bus stop on the main road at the GB junction and Stagecoach agree to stop at GB, we can increase the provision to some extent. The Ability bus, which is subsidised by the PC (£5,000 pa), is still a useful option for all residents. We are exploring the possibility of creating a Conservation Area and are awaiting a response from CDCs conservation officer regarding the process. Conservation areas carry some weight in opposing large scale development and protect areas of historic relevance and street scenes which have existed

for over 100 years.

After several years of negotiation between CDC and Hayfield Homes, we are at last on our way to taking over the open space associated with the Community Hall in Garners Field. The delay has occurred because we have had to make sure that the PC is not liable for any of the legal costs.

Allotments: This is one of the most precious assets of our parish and we shall shortly be reviewing the situation with allotment plots which are not being cultivated. Tenants will be contacted to remind them of their obligations and where we can see that plots are not being cultivated we shall take appropriate action.

Finally, I'm pleased to report, that our clerk has once again achieved a perfect pass with our annual accounts and these will be published on the website and on local notice boards for your information.

Additional Notes: The chairman and clerk attended the Parish Liaison meeting recently and attended the planning and enforcement surgery on which we shall report later. The most relevant information being the delay in the publication of the draft CDC local plan and the fact that CDC do have more than a 5 year land supply, which is good news for parish councils, since developers use a lack of a 5 year land supply as a lever to gain consent for their planning applications.



6th September as the next Vicar of The Shires' Edge Benefice .



I'm Sarah, and in my 23rd year of ordained ministry, mother of two fabulous young people, (a bookworm and a rower) and wife to Nick, a plant scientist and wonderfully supportive husband. As a family we enjoy listening to music, watching films, and eating together.

Bell Tower Conservation project Great Bourton

...update June 2023

On behalf of the Parochial Church Council (PCC)

- Work has commenced!
- Further to the update in the May Broadsheet:
- Going forward:
 - As mentioned we continue with fundraising events and activities having reached our initial target of £72,300 as we need to have some contingency also. Now the scaffold is up the fabric of the tower has been re-assessed and findings are:
 - asbestos in the roof tiles contains chrysotile fibres which require removal and disposal by a specialist firm this has been contracted to start 22 June latest.
 - oak roof battens need to be replaced.
 - stonework in some of the higher areas is crumbling worse than expected.
 - a full survey of the wooden structure is being considered now that closer inspection has been achieved - we are waiting the opinion of two structural engineers.
- This will mean an increase in the project costs to cover the asbestos removal and new oak battens and we have managed to contain this to £1,700, and so we will be exploring further avenues of funding.
- The stonework repair and wooden structure survey will incur additional cost and we wait for further news of this.
- We are currently still on track for an end of July completion, despite the delay for the asbestos removal.
- Please do be safe and mindful of the area around the Bell Tower whilst work is underway.
