

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#### THE BOURTONS' PARISH COUNCIL

DRAFT Minutes of the Council meeting held in the Village Hall on Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> September 2023 at 19:30hrs

In attendance: Cllr Mrs S Upton (Chairman), Cllr Mrs G Duckworth, Cllr A Johnson, Cllr Mrs J Beales, DCllr P Chapman, Stephen Bowen (Clerk)

**Apologies**: Non received. **Declarations of Interest**: None

Public Participation: 7 members of the public attended.

**Minutes**: The previous Council meeting (July) minutes were reviewed and a change was made as requested by Chairman of the Village Hall (VH) Trustees; they were then approved for signature.

#### Item

#### **Public Participation**

2 groups of residents attended representing residents of Garners Field and the Trustees of the VH. The following points were raised and Council will formally respond in due course.

**Garners Field residents**: concerns were raised about the possibility of a bus stop on the Southam Road to enable passing Stagecoach buses (77 service) to stop and collect passengers, citing dangers to emerging traffic and pedestrians, visual intrusion and questioning the need for the bus service. Questions were asked about the management of the open space at Garners field - point 110 refers.

**VH Trustees**: following recent emails, concern was expressed that such correspondence was minuted, this was addressed and it was confirmed that all information requiring action by the PC must be dealt with in a transparent manner and in line with regulations with all matters being minuted. The issue of damp appearing in the VH was raised and the PC are organising 3 quotations for the necessary work in line the financial regulations. Chairman will keep the VHMC committee informed of progress.

## **Footpaths - Progress Report**

Report received of a partially blocked footpath connecting to the bottom of Mill Lane; this has been reported to OCC CAO and will be inspected to confirm if it is a landowner or OCC matter.

The footpath connecting South View to Main Street is partially blocked by an overhanging branch, this has been reported to our contractor and will be attended to this month. More thorough pruning of this path, which is not adopted by OCC will take place later in the year.

Residents have expressed concerns about the condition of the public footpath near the bus stop on Main Street and the junction with School Lane, used extensively by school children. This will be reported on FixMyStreet and contact made with the local Highways Inspector.

## Highways & Road defects - Progress Report

Council is pleased to see that the promised 20mph speed limit, replacing the previous 30mph zone has now been installed. Reports for the reinstatement of Junction road signage has been lodged. Concern was expressed that a couple of signs had been inappropriately sited and this will be discussed with OCC. It is now intended to re-introduce the Community Speedwatch project so that

monitoring of speeds can commence and we have three more volunteers for this.

Continued concerns being expressed about the work done by Voneus re broadband installation in GB; it was noted that there has been no similar issues in LB. Previously reported issues re verge damage has been addressed and the PC would like to record its appreciation of the efforts of Mark Burgess, OCC for his attendance and monitoring of this matter, which has been instrumental in achieving results. Council will formally write to him expressing our thanks for his support, particularly out of hours.

#### **Public Transport:**

Letter received from Ability CIC regarding final contribution from GF s106 funds towards provision of minibus service. Info required on performance of service prior to making final payment.

## Planning applications:

#### **New applications:**

23/01929/F: Mr Curtis-Green, Manor House, Manor Road, GB: re land behind Mole End, Main Street, GB: development of 7 dwellings. Following consultation with planners advice received advising density should be increased: subsequently revised application submitted for 9 dwellings on smaller site. Further information required to enable proper consideration and response. 23/01244/F: Mr Sparrow, Kings Cottage, The Green, Main Street, GB: amendments to original application; further information required.

#### **Decisions**

23/1413/REM: Fernhill Estates: Claridge Gardens, GB: 2 dwellings, reserved matters: **PERMITTED**: concerns regarding outstanding flood risk management at site requires further information.

**Conservation area potential application**: PC await a response from the CDC Conservation Officer, repeated efforts have been made to establish contact, all unsuccessful. Request made to DCllr Chapman to assist.

#### **County & District Councillors report:**

CCIIr Reynolds absent so no OCC update; DCIIr Chapman participated in discussions on planning, no further info added.

#### **Defibrillators:**

Both defibrillators reported working, but require new batteries, quote requested and response awaited. Replacement cost is £199+VAT: order authorised.

#### Website:

New Bus timetables will be added.

# **Projects update:**

**Garners Field**: comments made in public participation; transfer of land and LAP at front of site proceeding, but no update from CDC re progress, anticipated completion at year end. Request for maintenance of roadside hedge made and advised it is OCC responsibility, but PC mowing contractor will be asked to trim footpath side to allow unhindered use of path. Further request made regarding performance of current GF public open spaces:

Clerk advised this is responsibility of residents' management company and Ground Solutions, Council is keen that appropriate maintenance work is carried out but challenges exist in respect of funding. Council would be prepared to offer support to finding a resolution, but responsibility lies with residents.

#### **Playgrounds & Public Spaces:**

Following receipt of annual inspection reports and work schedule will be created and costs obtained.

GB Playground: further attempts will be made to contact owners of land to discuss potential renewal of lease which expires in 2026 to enable development of long-term plan to ensure provision of playground.

#### Allotments:

Allotment rent was discussed: it was **RESOLVED** that a rent increase would be required to cover existing and planned expenditure and this will be confirmed at the annual Tenants' meeting to be arranged for later this month. In preparation for Tenants' annual meeting an inspection of plots will be arranged with results presented at meeting.

Reports of rotting plot gate posts have been received, and Council recognises that work is required to maintain the standard of the site. This will be discussed at Tenants' meeting.

#### Halls:

**VH**: Trustees & Chairman attended meeting as reported above. Work to obtain quotes in respect of reported damp problem to be undertaken. A formal response to the issues raised in the public participation session will be made. The Chairman updated the meeting with details of recent repairs which have been completed.

#### **Healthcare:**

Following knowledge of concerns about the future viability of the Cropredy Surgery, discussions have been held with the practice partners re how this Council can assist in securing the future. A letter of support to the Surgery will be submitted and Council will liaise with other PC's in the catchment area advising of our concerns and asking for their support for the Surgery.

#### **Finance & Administration:**

The FIN REP was circulated and it was **RESOLVED** that the associated bank reconciliation be accepted and that 2 payments totalling £1,294.00 be approved. To comply with the requirements of the Transparency Code those in excess of £100 are listed below:

DWG Windows & Doors: repairs to Village Hall: £540.00

SW Services: August mowing: £754.00

The allocation of Fairport monies received from ticket sales was raised, and it was **AGREED** that in future the PC would publish its intention regarding use of these funds.

A new Code of Conduct for Parish Councillors has been published by OCC, and it was **AGREED** that this Council would adopt this, with Cllrs signing the Code to confirm their support.

The Clerk was pleased to be able to report that progress has been made in identifying a highly suitable candidate for this role and Council anticipates being able to announce an appointment at the October meeting, following acceptance of a contract by the individual.

Our insurers have confirmed the renewal premium for our policy which is subject to a 3 year long term agreement. This shows an increase of approx. 9% which has been queried; Cllrs **RESOLVED**, following a discussion on the increase, that renewal should be accepted.

The current Councillor vacancy was discussed and the Chairman reported that a potential candidate has been identified and it is hoped that discussions can be opened this month.

### **Correspondence:**

Email received from OCC re new tree planting scheme which was discussed; in view of the difficulties in identifying a location for the recent new tree provided under a different scheme, it was accepted that finding a location for planting a small woodland would prove impossible at this time, the matter will be kept under consideration should a suitable location become available.

#### **New business:**

Following the refusal of the Vistry Homes application for 170 houses in Hanwell, the issue of a potential solar farm between Hanwell and Shotteswell remains a concern especially as the proposed 200 acre solar farm will be visible from Great Bourton. It was **AGREED** that Council would continue to maintain contact with Hanwell PC to understand what support may be appropriate, when any application is submitted.

Meeting closed at 21:35hrs. Minutes drafted by the Clerk on 13/09/23. The next meeting will be held on  $10^{th}$  October 2023 in the Community Hall commencing at 19:30hrs.
